Heifer International's mission is to work with communities to end world hunger and poverty and to care for the Earth. Through this mission,

animals are selected and purchased with the children's offerings. "Giving an animal is like giving someone a small business, providing wool, milk, eggs and more. Animal donations can provide families a hand up, increasing access to medicine, school, food and a sustainable livelihood." Children bring their offerings to Sunday school and place them in a classroom animal-decorated container. Our program was jump-started by Pumpkin Sale proceeds, which goes to the purchase of a pig. Come to the Sunday school hall from time to time to watch our ark fill from the generosity of our children! Traditional offering envelopes are available in children's worship bags (available as you enter worship) if preferred.

Per Capita for 2017

What is Per Capita? It is a way Presbyterians share equally, responsibly and interdependently in the costs of governing the Presbyterian Church (USA), no matter the size of their churches. Per capita contributions are requested from every congregation based on each church's total active membership. The activities funded are generally referred to as ecclesiastical in nature, and are distinct from program or mission activities, which generally are funded from other sources.



The 2017 per capita apportionment for each active member of the church is set at \$33.38 by the PC (USA).

Through per capita, Presbytery of Chicago churches:

- help congregations with pastoral ministries
- train and support interim ministers
- resolve congregational conflicts
- care for ministers and Christian educators and their families
- help prepare people for service as ordained ministers

When members do not cover their personal per capita apportionment, the shortfall is withdrawn from our congregation's General Fund, reducing our congregation's ability to accomplish our own budgetary goals. Won't you please help with this expense?

A blue per capita envelope is in each member's offering envelope box. For those members who contribute online, there is a per capita option
