Deacon's PADS Food Drive

Our annual PADS clothing drive usually occurs at this time of the year. However, with PADS now housing everyone in hotels, their primary needs have changed from clothing to food. To help meet that need, the Deacon's Community Ministry will be collecting food items from the list below today and next Sunday, February 4. Food can also be dropped off between 4-6 pm on Wednesdays or during the week under the coat rack across from the office.

Needed items:

Breakfast: Bagels with cream cheese, instant oatmeal, store-bought muffins, granola or breakfast bars, breakfast meal replacement drinks

Lunch: Crackers, bags of chips, instant ramen noodles (cups or packs), protein bars, tuna or chicken salad packs, beef jerky microwavable popcorn, Jello cups, apple sauce pouches

Dinner: Non-perishable microwave dinners, canned baked beans, mac and cheese (boxes or cups), canned chili, microwavable rice packs, sardines

Drinks: juice packs (apple or fruit juice), water bottles, hot chocolate packs

Other items: Can openers, plastic cutlery and plates

Special items: Jars of baby food, small containers of milk (that will fit in a hotel room size fridge)
