THE HYMN after our Land Acknowledgement Statement was written in Canada for the 30th Anniversary of the United Church of Canada's Apology to First Nations Peoples. The composer was a commissioner at the 1986 council when the Apology was brought by their denomination's Moderator to the First Nations Elders. The whole council was gathered in a circle dance around a bonfire as the Moderator and Elders met in a tipi nearby. It was his hope that the hymn would remind them of the need to continue faithfully on the journey towards reconciliation. So also here in Libertyville may we voice our own renewing commitment to repair.
