Did you know? Each year our church shares in the life and work of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) through a *per capita* contribution to the PC(USA) and the Presbytery of Chicago. For 2026, the amount is \$38.00 per member. Per capita supports our shared responsibility for church governance and mission, funds leadership and oversight at the General Assembly, Synod, and Presbytery levels, and sustains essential ministries such as pastoral care and conflict resolution. It also connects us to the broader mission of our denomination. You'll see this amount listed on your statement as a reminder to reimburse the church for your portion of this shared commitment.
